### Special Events Update: May - October

The following event assessment was conducted from March - October

### Fontana Car Show – May 5

The May Fontana Car Show started off a little slow due to inclement weather but car enthusiasts from near and far bared the cold to enjoy a variety of classics on display. Nearly **75 vehicles and over 125 spectators** filled the Civic Center Campus.

### Fontana Days Parade – May 6

Presented by the Fontana Exchange Club, the Annual Fontana Days Parade themed "Summer Fun" took place along Sierra Ave and circled to Orange Way and Mango Ave to conclude at Miller Park. Over **50** parade entries traveled the route via foot and custom float where they were greeted by nearly **800** parade spectators.

### Working Dogs for Warriors: Community Business Marketplace – May 18

The City of Fontana Co-Sponsored an event with Working Dogs for Warriors to host their 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Service to our Community Conference at the Jessie Turner Health & Fitness Center on Thursday, May 18. The goal of the event was to connect essential resources to local organizations in an effort to positively impact outreach work. The afternoon was filled with great networking of the over **200** in attendance.

### Water Safety Event – May 20

The summer kicked-off in Aquatics with a "Water Safety Challenge" which was held on Saturday, May 20, at the Fontana Park Aquatic Center. The Water Safety Challenge is an event held at numerous locations throughout Southern California in effort to promote safety while enjoying activities both in, and around water. The Fontana Aquatics Division operated 5 different water safety stations – including home pool safety, life jacket use, "reach and throw" saving techniques, CPR and First Aid. In addition, approximately 15 booths were present for both information and enjoyment. All of this, coupled with free Recreational Swim, was enjoyed by more than **700** attendees.

### LOVE Fontana – May 20

The City of Fontana partnered with Calvary Chapel Summit to Co-Sponsor the annual LOVE Fontana event on May 20 at Veterans Park. This free community events featured resource vendors, entertainment and free activities for family members of all ages. Over **500** patrons visited the park throughout the duration of the event.

### Fontana Arts Festival – May 20

The 2023 Fontana Arts Festival held on Saturday, May 20 was a great evening celebrating art and culture through music, dance, fine art, novelty art, and food.

This year's event hosted 40 vendor booths, 34 art vendors and 6 food vendors. There were live art demonstrations including pottery wheel ceramics, and sewing demonstrations. There were even workshops for visitors of all ages to learn the basics of drawing and makeup. The

main stage presented music from LALA Brass, Marieme and the headliner, Tomasina, plus dance performances from the Los Angeles Dancers and Choreographers group. An estimated **2,500** attended this year's event.

### Fontana Days Festival – June 1-4

The Fontana Exchange Club in partnership with the City of Fontana hosted the Annual Fontana Days Festival from June 1 – June 4 at Veterans Park. This staple event has brought a community carnival to Fontana for over 100 years. Throughout the duration of the weekend over **8,000** community members were able to enjoy rides, games, food, various entertainment, and more right in their backyard.

### Fontana Days Run – June 3

The 68<sup>th</sup> Annual Fontana Days Run took place on Saturday, June 3 along Sierra Ave. Nearly 2,000 participants from all over the nation gathered in Fontana to be a part of the World's Fastest Half Marathon Course. Between the two-day Fitness Expo and day of the Run over **5,000** participants and spectators of all ages enjoyed the festivities.

### Skate Nights - June 7, 14, 21, 28 & July 5, 12, 19, 26

Summer Events kicked off with weekly Skate Nights at Fontana Park Sports Pavilion. Every Wednesday throughout June and July from 6-8pm community members of all ages laced up their skates to enjoy free music and games. Throughout the eight-week series nearly **1,200** took part in the fun.

### Summer Concerts – June 8, 15, 22, 29 & July 6, 13, 20, 27

The Annual Summer Concert Series took place every Thursday in June and July from 7-9pm at Miller Park Amphitheater. This year's lineup brought in some of the highest attendance numbers as the community gathered to enjoy bands such as No Duh, Corazon de Mana, Kings of Queen, Dreaming of You, and more. The dance floor was packed each week, stomachs were full thanks to the delicious vendors, and children enjoyed all of the free activities. Over **15,000** spectators took part in the eight-week series

### Family Fun Night – June 10, July 8 & August 12

Family Fun Nights took place on Saturday, June 10 at Almeria Park, July 8 at Sycamore Hills Park and August 12 at Oak Grove Park. All events were from 6-9:30pm and included games booths, inflatables, activities, crafts and a movie on the giant inflatable screen to end the night. Collectively nearly **1,000** community members took part in the three events.

### 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration – July 1

The City of Fontana hosted the Annual 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration on a new day and at a new location! This year's free event took place at Summit High School on Saturday, July 1. Over **3,000** community members of all ages gathered to enjoy food and novelty vendors, live stage entertainment by Who's Bad, the Ultimate Michael Jackson tribute, and of course, ended the night with an amazing firework show.

### Fontana Car Show – July 7

The monthly Fontana Car Show series continued Friday, July 7 at the City Hall Campus from 5-9pm. Despite the heat, car enthusiasts gathered to enjoy various classics on display, live entertainment by Smokin Cobras, delicious food vendors, and various giveaways. Attendance for the evening reached nearly **50 vehicles and over 120 patrons**.

### Spring Street Night Market – July 21

Spring Street Night Market continues to draw community members of all ages. Over 40 food and novelty vendors lined the street showcasing a variety of unique foods and hand-crafted goods. In addition to the vendors, the event also included free activities for the kids, interactive booths, and DJ entertainment. Over **2,000** patrons took part in all the fun.

### CAP Resource Fair – July 29

The City of Fontana partnered with Water of Life/CityLink to provide the annual CAP Resource Fair. This co-sponsored event features local resource vendors, back to school giveaways, entertainment, and more. Each year this event continues to draw over **1,000** participants to enjoy all of the free to low-cost resources.

### Swim 2 Win – July 29

On the morning of Saturday, July 29, the annual "Swim 2 Win" swim meet was held at the Fontana Park Aquatic Center. This "mock swim meet" event has now been established for several years and provides all summer swim lesson participants a chance to use their newly learned swimming skills in a fun and competitive setting. Approximately **200 swimmers competed while a crowd of more than 300 friends and family** cheered them toward a fast finish. The event was free to swim lesson participants and all swimmers were provided with a cooler and goggles as well as prizes being awarded after each race.

### Fontana Car Show – August 4

The monthly Fontana Car Show series continued in August. Although attendance was slightly lower, the nearly **40 cars and 100 spectators** still enjoyed the live entertainment of the HUGE Band and delicious eats from the local vendors while strolling all the vintage and custom vehicles on display.

### A Sound Mind: Mental Health & Wellness Resource Fair – August 19

Working Dogs for Warriors partnered with the City of Fontana to Co-Sponsor A Sound Mind: Mental Health & Wellness Resource Fair. The event took place on Saturday, August 19 at Veterans Park and featured a variety of mental health and wellness vendors, entertainment, and giveaways. Over **250** community members enjoyed all of the free resources.


